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TERMS OF REFERENCE

APPOINTMENT OF A SERVICE PROVIDER TO CONDUCT LIFESTYLE AUDITS ON SIX (06) SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT OFFICIALS

1. OBJECTIVE

To appoint a suitably qualified and experienced independent service provider to conduct lifestyle audits on six (6) officials of Limpopo Tourism Agency: One (1) Chief Financial Officer, One (1) Senior Manager: Supply Chain Management, One (1) SCM Manager and Three (3) SCM Clerks.

2. BACKGROUND

The Limpopo Standing Committee on Public Accounts (SCOPA) has recommended that the Accounting Authority must appoint an independent firm to conduct a Lifestyle Audit on both management and officials within SCM.

3. SCOPE AND EXTENT OF THE WORK

3.1 THE SUCCESSFUL SERVICE PROVIDERS WILL PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING SERVICES:

- 3.1.1 The service provider will be required to use a comprehensive approach for the lifestyle audits including assembling the financial and behavioral profile as well as performing the net-worth, expenditure and bank deposit analysis methods of everyone as per the Association of Certified Fraud Examiner Guidelines. The service provider must indicate in their proposal/bid document that their methodology complies with this approach.
- 3.1.2 The lifestyle audit should as a minimum include the management of the submission and analysis of a comprehensive questionnaire, possible interviews, and the verification thereof from relevant sources (e.g. banking records, declarations etc.) of the following: Total income or sources of funds of the individual for the period

identified (including salaries, investment income, gifts, sale of assets, insurance proceeds, inheritance, commissions, awards including comparison to bank statements, etc.);

- a) Large and/or significant income and expenditure transactions and the funding thereof;
- b) Business interests, directorships, and resultant dividends/profit distribution or any other related income.
- c) Personal investments and resultant interest including shares and bonds including offshore investments bonds;
- d) Assets of the individual (including property, vehicles, collectibles, bank accounts, jewelry, cash on hand, designer clothing and materials like art, land, livestock, etc;
- e) Liabilities of the individual (loans, credit cards, mortgages, notarial bonds, etc.);
- f) Declarations of any transfer of assets to family members, trusts, friends, etc.;
- g) Perform credit searches;
- h) Review of income tax compliance and disclosure;
- i) Review foreign travel, hospitality and other benefits of a material nature;
- j) Criminal background check (through SAPS Criminal Record Centre [CRC], and only with the subject's consent);
- k) General pre-qualification criteria set by LTA, have been met; and
- l) Any other reviews as required to finalize the lifestyle audit including a review of publicly available information pertaining to immediately family members.
- 3.1.3 The lifestyle audit to be conducted considering the legislative framework included but not limited to the other legislation such as POPI Act or any legal/compliance requirements as applicable to individuals subjected to lifestyle audits.
- 3.1.4 The lifestyle audit must include interviews to be conducted with the relevant individuals to provide clarity or any information that is required during the audit.
- 3.1.5 Utmost care must be exercised during the lifestyle audits to:
 - a) Obtain evidence in a lawful manner;
 - b) Ensure the integrity of data collected;

- c) Maintain confidentiality of all information; and
- d) Ensure that the rights of the relevant persons are not infringed upon.

3.1.6 The results/outcomes of the audit must explicitly indicate:

- a) Whether the lifestyle of the member of the official
 is commensurate with his/her income and flag any inconsistencies thereto;
- b) Whether the OFFICIAL and (as determined for that assignment) received any income other than the individual's salary and whether any income could cause a possible conflict in the role of the OFFICIAL member or the performance of his/her duties;
- c) Whether any interest held by the OFFICIAL member (as applicable) represents a potential conflict or may interfere with the duties as an OFFICIAL member in the performance of his/her duties.
- d) Where applicable that such sources of income have been declared/approved as required; and
- e) Any other matter relevant to the objective of the lifestyle audit performed.
- f) The data obtained, and all working papers generated during the audit of the OFFICIAL member LTA for safekeeping (Both hard copy and electronic versions).

3.2INDEPENDENCE AND OBJECTIVITY OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER:

- 3.2.1 All lifestyle audits need to be treated as confidential in line with the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE) and Institute of Commercial Forensic Practitioners (ICFP) code of Ethics and Professional Standards.
- 3.2.2 In carrying out the work, the service provider must ensure that their staff maintains their objectivity and independence.

3.2.3 The service provider shall:

a) Have no executive or managerial powers or functions;

- b) Not be involved in the day to day operations of the LTA or have any relationship with any staff member of the LTA
- c) Not be responsible for the detailed development or implementation of new systems and procedures;
- d) Report to the Accounting Officer in respect to the lifestyle audit of LTA officials;

3.2.4 The LTA shall:

- a.) Provide the service provider with the list of LTA officials to be audited
- b.) Corporate Services division and Risk and Compliance Unit will manage the project

The first phase of evaluation is checking and verification of all mandatory documents to be submitted by the bidders and compliance to specification.

The minimum qualifying score for functionality is **65%**. Bidders who fail to obtain the minimum qualifying score of **65%** will be disqualified.

PHASE 3: EVALUATION IN TERMS OF PRICE AND PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

Only bids that achieve the minimum qualifying score/percentage for functionality will be evaluated further in accordance with the 80/20 preference point system prescribe in Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022.

The PPPFA prescribes that the lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price. Bidders that quoted higher prices will score lower points for price on a pro-rata basis.

When calculating prices:

- a) Unconditional discounts will be taken into account for evaluation purposes; and
- b) Conditional discounts will not be taken into account for evaluation purposes but would be implemented when payment is affected.

- c. Only the tender with the highest number of points scored may selected.
- d. CSD report will be used to as a means of verification of the specific goals.
