DRIVING

In Southern Africa, driving is on the left, and pedestrians should therefore look right, then left before crossing. Any valid driver's licence is accepted in South Africa, provided it bears the photograph and signature of the holder and is printed in English.

ACCESSIBLE SERVICES

South African Airways, most of the country's hotels and the majority of the rest camps in the National Parks offer facilities for the disabled. You can rent wheelchairs and other aids in most cities and the larger car rental companies can provide vehicles with hand controls.

LANGUAGE

Whilst English is the language of administration and is widely spoken, South Africa has 10 other official languages. These are Afrikaans, Ndebele, Northern Sotho, Southern Sotho, Swati, Tsonga, Tswana, Venda, Xhosa and Zulu.

SHOPPING HOURS

Shops are open from 08:30 - 17:00, Mondays to Fridays and from 08:30 - 12:30 on Saturdays. However, major shopping centres are abuzz till later on Saturdays and are also open on Sunday mornings

MALARIA

The Eastern regions of the Mopani and Vhembe are low-risk malaria areas. Antimalarial drugs are recommended from September to May for all travellers.

The northern region of Limpopo is home to the Mapungubwe National Park. The east includes the largest part of the Kruger National Park while the greater Kruger includes the Timbavati, Kapama, Thornybush, Balule, Makalali , Karongwe, Klaserie and many smaller game and nature reserves.

Trails

A great variety of walking, hiking, slack packing, horse and mountain bike trails can be enjoyed throughout Limpopo province. You are definately spoilt for choice. Choose between safari and wildlife trails, wilderness trails, misty afro montane mountain trails and forest trails.

Limpopo birding routes

Over 600 bird species have been recorded in the province of which 420 are resident. The area offers pleasant and easy bird watching and bird photography. Routes include the Soutpansberg birding route, The Capricorn-Letaba route and the Waterberg birding route.

The Waterberg Meander is a network of fascinating people and places bound together by this vast conservation area. There are private lodges, cultural villages, craft projects, social upliftment initiatives and national parks. Of special note, the Waterberg also protects the only savannah biosphere in the world.

Rock art

There are over 700 rock art sites in Limpopo. These include San Paintings. Khoekhoe and Northern Sotho paintings. The art is of great value, not only from an aesthetic view, but also for the insight it gives, in particular into the world view and religion of the San, as well as information about types of animals occurring in the environment in earlier times.

Moholoholo Animal Rehabilitation Centre

In the shadow of the majestic Drakensberg Mountains, this well-established sanctuary is home to a wide variety of African wildlife. Moholoholo Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre aims to contribute to the conservation of endangered species and the rehabilitation of injured and poisoned wildlife.

Hoedspruit Endangered Species Centre

This unique African wildlife facility focuses on conservation and the sustainability of rare, vulnerable and threatened species. Founded on passion, the centre has adopted a holistic approach to its conservation activities, such as the educating of surrounding communities, tourism, breeding, rehabilitation and anti-poaching, to name a few.

Makapans Caves

Makapansgat is a palaeontological site of international significance. Do not miss the opportunity to visit Makapan's Caves where huge herds of antelope and human-like primates fought off gigantic sabre tooth cats thousands of years ago.

Mapungubwe National Park

It is believed that Mapungubwe was home to an advanced culture of people. The civilization thrived as a sophisticated trading centre from around 1200 to 1300 AD. It was the centre of the largest kingdom in the subcontinent, where a highly sophisticated people traded gold and ivory with China, India and Egypt. The region had a population of more than 5 000 inhabitants.

Sacred Places

Visit the sacred lake Fundudzi, which lies at the heart of VhaVenda mysticism or the Thathe Vondo Forest, with its giant hardwoods, tumbling streams with canopies of trees ferns and creepers.


Huge Baobabs


The largest baobab in the country can be found near Sagole Spa. The tree is over 3 000 years old, with a girth of 43m.



The Waterberg Savannah Biosphere

The Waterberg Biosphere is one of 500 UNESCO-recognised biosphere reserves on the planet, and is the only savannah biosphere reserve in the world! It is approximately 1.7 - 2.2 million hectares in size.

The area consists of low mountain ranges and escarpments, incorporating many rivers, streams and swamps. The biosphere stretches for 150 kilometres in an arc, from Thabazimbi in the West, Mookophong in the centre to Mokopane in the east. Apart from the spectacular


scenery and wilderness areas, there are many nature reserves and culture-and-heritage sites.

The natural attractions of the Waterberg remain its greatest allure: the Waterberg Savannah Biosphere, Nylsvley wetlands, Marakele National Park, Lapalala Wilderness Area and the hot mineral springs of Bela-Bela. Little wonder the area has been described as a geographical marvel, supporting a biome of about 14,500km2 and offering scenic vistas, exciting game viewing in its numerous game reserves and a holiday in the mountains - rustic and close to nature or splendidly opulent in luxurious lodges.

The area has some of the best San Rock Art sites in South Africa and the Makapan's Valley Caves, where the earliest homonid remains were discovered, nestle discreetly in the Strydompoort mountains.

The prolific bird-life, with over three hundred species listed, creates a bird watcher's paradise in the Waterberg region.

Bela Bela: "Boiling-Boiling" in Tswana

Long before the mineral waters at Bela-Bela were used therapeutically, the curative waters have often been described as nature's gift to humankind. They were discovered by the Batswana in the 1800's and named Bela-Bela, meaning "boilingboiling"

The town, formerly known as 'Warmbaths', owes its origins to the hot mineral springs that bubble out of the earth at about 22,000 I/hr at a temperature of approximately 53°C. Said water is rich in minerals and is believed to have curative properties restoring sanity and a sense of wellbeing to all who holiday in Bela-Bela.

The pleasantly mild climate during the winter months and an average of 286 sunny days a year add to the popularity of the destination. The town is just over an hour's

drive from Gauteng and lies on the Spingbok Flats on the highway to the north. Bela-Bela is also a gateway to the southern Waterberg.

The modern, internationally-renowned spa has become a trademark of Bela-Bela. It offers a large mineral-water indoor pool, a high-temperature pool (rheumatism bath), sauna, underwater massage and hydrotherapy. It is based on the Baden-Baden concept and is the second largest of its kind in the world. Ailments such as rheumatism, arthritis, muscular pains, skin problems and headaches are treated there. Accommodation at the spa caters for a variety of tastes and budgets and entertainment facilities for families abound.

Lephalale: "To Flow" in Tswana

Situated on the Mokolo River (a tributary of the Limpopo) about 60km from the Botswana border and the Stockpoort border post, this tranquil but prosperous Waterberg town is home to close on 20,000 people, offering excellent game viewing opportunities, and sports tourism, among other activities.

The town was started on the farm known as Waterkloof in 1960 and was named after the original owners of the farm. Lephalale is a hunting mecca and prime eco-tourism area drawing thousands of tourists each year. The mild winter months and moderate summer evenings make this a popular venue for camping and stargazing. The natural beauty of the Waterberg, together with the spectacular sunsets and abundance of game, compose an ideal

holiday destination. The absence of malaria is an added bonus for tourists.

Lephalale forms part of the world-renowned Waterberg Savannah Biosphere

Today Lephalale is well known for its coal-mining industry, which besides tourism, is the economic mainstay of the town. The Kumba Grootgeluk open-cast mine is the largest mine of its kind in South Africa and provides ISCOR in Tshwane with high-grade coal for iron and steel production. The Matimba Power Station - the largest dry-cooled power station in the world - also put Lephalale on the map. Sight seeing trips to the station can be arranged.

D'Nyala Nature reserve

Located 15 km to the south-east of Lephalale, this reserve offers a good combination of game reserve, conference centre and a well-equipped camp. The game reserve is home to the nyala antelope, as well as 60 other mammal species, including white rhino, giraffe, waterbuck, zebra, tsessebe, eland and others.

It also includes a variety of predators such as leopard, brown hyena jackal and smaller cats. Some impressive Nyala Berry and Baobab trees can be encountered here.

Modimolle: "the forefather's spirit has eaten'


Thomas Baines, well-known explorer, naturalist and painter, tells a fascinating story of how the Nyl River received its name. Known to the locals as Mokgalakwena (fierce crocodile) the north-flowing river was mistakenly believed to be the Nile by a group of Voortrekkers known as the "Jerusalem gangers" (Jerusalem Travellers'), who arrived here in 1886.

They believed if they travelled long and far enough, they would find the Holy land and a pyramid-shaped hill nearby strengthened their conviction that they had crossed Africa and reached Egypt. The village of Nylstroom was laid out on a farm in February 1966. Today the town of Nylstroom has been renamed Modimolle after the prominent hill close by which the locals regard as their holy mountain. The town is the commercial centre of the

Waterberg Region and is famous for its export grapes and soft fruits such as peaches and watermelons. Other important products are cattle, game, peanuts and maize.

Regarded as the gateway to the Waterberg, the area is particularly renowned for its variety of outdoor recreation options, ranging from horse safaris, hiking and nature trails to luxury hunting safaris. Birdwatching at the internationally famous Nylsvley Nature Reserve, where up to 400 species are easily spotted in one day, also attracts many visitors to the area.

The pleasant climate with hot summers and moderate winters, makes for an all-year-round holiday destination, a mere one-and-a-half hours' drive from Johannesburg on the N1 route to Zimbabwe.



MODIMOLLE TRAVEL INFO Nylsvley Nature Reserve

The Limpopo Province Nylsvley Nature Reserve is managed by Limpopo Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism. Limpopo Tourism Agency is responsible for hospitality.

This 4000 ha reserve is a mosaic of habitats: Acacia, Combretum and broad leafed woodland and grassveld floodplain. It lies between 1080 and 1155 m above sea level and receives an average of 620mm rainfall per annum. Summers are hot, winters mild with occasional very low temperatures.

The reserve supports about 1 000 large mammals including breeding herds of the threatened Roan and Tsessebe. Giraffe, Zebra, Kudu, Waterbuck, Impala, Reedbuck, Warthog, Porcupine, Bush-babies and Ostrich are commonly seen, Bushpig, Leopard, Brown Hyena are resident. Some 58 species of reptiles are present including snakes (always wear sensible shoes!)

Nearly 400 species of birds are known to reside or visit occasionally, including 102 water bird species.

About 800 plant species support the biodiversity that makes Nylsyley famous.

Nylsvley is a Ramsar site, a wetland of international importance for the protection of waterfowl.

Mokopane named after king Mokopane

A stunning bush veld environment and multi-cultural community and history give Mokopane a unique character. The town and immediate surroundings boast fascinating ancient caves, the 'Big Five', San rock art, curios, typically bush veld food and drink such as biltong and mampoer (a traditional, and potent - African alcoholic beverage distilled from fruit), tropical gardens and traditional dancing. The area is rich in minerals like platinum, diamonds and granite. In the adjacent rural area of Mahwereleng, traditional lifestyles are still maintained. Mokopane also offers a wonderful selection of outdoor activities ranging from hiking, camping and 4x4 trails to birding, angling and game-viewing. Just two hours from Gauteng, the town is the perfect getaway destination and the ideal stopover for travellers en route to Botswana, Zimbabwe, Polokwane and the

Kruger National Park. Mokopane serves a rich agricultural area in which wheat, tobacco, cotton, beef, maize, peanuts and citrus fruit are farmed. The- Zebediela Citrus Estate 55 krn to the southeast is one of the largest citrus farms in the southern hemisphere. The bush veld vegetation of the area features many acacia trees and aloes, which are at their best in June and July.

One of the most notable archaeological and historical sites in the country is found at Makapan's Valley, 15 km north of the town, The sediments, fossils, bones and artefacts found in the caves in the valley, preserve a unique record of homonid habitation and evolution dating back 3.3 million years.

Mokopane has several great hiking and MTB trails. Other adventures include bass fishing and birding.



MOKOPANE CULTURE AND HERITAGE ACTIVITIES

The cave of hearths

Visitors to Mokopane should not miss the opportunity of going on a guided tour of Makapan's Valley where extensive cultural and palaeontological deposits have played a crucial role in furthering our understanding of later human evolution and the appearance of modern man. The Cave of Hearths is one of only two Stone Age sites in the world that contain an unbroken sequence of artefacts from the Earlier Stone Age to the Later Stone Age.

Mookgophong:

Situated at the foot of the Swaershoek mountains, this Waterberg town is surrounded by nature reserves and steaming hot springs. The moderate climate and numerous resorts in the area attract many holiday-makers.

The settlement dates back to the late 1800's when it was an outspan area for the Pretoria-Pietersburg mail coach. Although a village eventually developed around a railway station on the farm Naboomspruit, the town owes its growth to the' discovery of minerals in the early 1900s.

The discovery of tin deposits on the farm Doornhoek in 1910 turned the village into a boom town of tents, cabaret artists and trading stores. A later discovery of platinum added to the development of the town.

Tin and fluorspar are still mined here. Mookgophong serves a thriving farming industry based on cattle, maize, tobacco, groundnuts and citrus fruit.

The naboom, after which the town was previously named, is the massive candelabra tree that grows in profusion on the banks of a nearby spruit.

The area around Mookgophong boasts numerous trails and opportunities for leisurely walks and hiking tours where lovers of the outdoors can enjoy the unique flora of the beautiful Waterberg.

Anglers will enjoy the Frikkie Geyser Dam and Doorndraai dam Nature Reserve. There are exciting prospects for game viewing and birding in the district.



Thabazimbi, meaning 'mountain of iron' is the Tswana name for the town and refers to the highly lucrative iron ore reef first discovered here in 1919 and mined since the 1930s when iron and steel production started. The town was proclaimed in 1953 and today the ISCOR Steelworks in Tshwane still draw much of their raw material from Thabazimbi.

Thabazimbi is also good farming country, particularly for cattle-ranching and gamefarming. Nature and eco-tourism activities are equally important and the region is fast becoming a well-known and popular destination for nature-lovers.

The annual Game Festival held in May showcases the hunting potential of the area, while- placing emphasis on the importance of nature conservation and ecotourism. Exhibitions and a game auction form part of-the festival.

The Marakele National Park, just 10 km outside Thabazimbi to the west, is one of the highlights in the area. Meaning 'place of sanctuary' in Tswana, the park is the pulse of the Waterberg Mountains. All the large game-species - from elephant and rhino to the big cats, as well as an amazing variety of birds, including the' largest colony of the endangered Cape Vulture (more than eight hundred breeding pairs) in the world - have settled here. The park is also home to an impressive array of plant life.

Located in the transitional zone between the dry western and moister eastern regions of South Africa, the park is characterised by the contrast of imposing.

mountainous landscapes, grass-clad hills and deep valleys. Rare finds of yellowwood and cedar trees as well as five-metre-high cycads and tree ferns are some of the plant species found here. The park is situated approximately 250 km from Gauteng and offers modern safari tented accommodation, as 'Nell as a rustic bush camp for small groups. Marakele can be explored along various 4x4 routes, but can also be visited in a normal sedan car.

The park is being 'extended eastwards to incorporate the Welgevonden conservancy along the upper reaches of. the Sterkstroom river. Accommodation in the general Thabazimbi area provides a wonderful base from which to explore this fascinating region. Activities to be enjoyed include 4x4 trails, cycling, angling, hiking, archery and various other sports.

MARAKELE BIRDING

Arguably the Park's biggest birding attraction, is the largest colony of Cape Vultures in the world (around 800 breeding pairs).

The park is an excellent place to look for raptors, with many species using the uplift generated off the cliff faces of the Waterberg to ride thermals. Apart from the vultures, visitors should look for African Harrier Hawk (Gymnogene), Jackal Buz za rd and several eagle species, including Verreaux's (Black), African Hawk, Black-chested (breasted) Snakeand Brown Snake Eagle.

The Marakele National Park is in the heart of the Waterberg Mountains. Marakele. Tswana name means ,place of sanctuary'. The reserve has an impressive variety of wildlife due to its location in the transitional zone between the dry western and moister eastern regions of South Africa.

ACCOMMODATION

Marakele is a wilderness area with limited tourism facilities for everyone. Much of the park requires a 4x4 vehicle. The safari tent camp has 10 units, one of which is **accessible to people in wheelchairs**, with an access ramp and adapted ablution facilities (roll-in shower). No accessible facilities are available at the Bush Camp.

4X4 TRAIL EXPERIENCE

Explore the Waterberg Mountain's wilderness areas. The Marakele 4x4 Eco Trail is a 3-day (2 nights) outdoor adventure spanning the wilderness (primitive zone) of Marakele National Park which is the core of the Waterberg Biosphere Reserve.

FACILITIES AT MARAKELE

The Kwaggasvlakte plains immediately north of the reception/office complex and camping site can be traversed in a normal sedan although certain areas might be a bit challenging. The entrance roads to the safari tent camp and bush camp and the narrow track up to the towers, can also be accessed with a sedan. Most other roads will present difficult terrain.

In an effort to keep the park ecosystem as undisturbed as possible, most facilities are located outside the park in the adjacent town of Thabazimbi.

WELGEVONDEN

GAME RESERVE

Welgevonden Game Reserve is in the Waterberg Biosphere, declared by UNESCO as the only savannah biosphere in the world. The 38,200ha game reserve is a mountainous area and is one of the most accessible malaria-free reserves in South Africa.

Major game species have been reintroduced into the reserve since 1994.

Welgevonden is now home to over 50 different mammals, including the Big Five. The diversity of habitat leads to a wide range of wildlife with grassy plains abounding with antelope from the largest eland to the diminutive duiker; and cheetah, lion and leopard are regularly seen close by.


There are also numerous rare and unusual species such as brown hyena, aardwolf, pangolin and

aardvark – all best seen at night. Over 300 bird species can be seen on the reserve, including rare blue cranes which breed in the southern section early in the year.

Take N1 North Highway from Johannesburg. Take the Mookgophong (Naboomspruit) R101A offramp/exit . In Mookgophong, take the R101A (29km) till you reach the Sterkrivier (Doorndraai Dam) turnoff. Turn left and continue for 22km till you reach the Haakdoring turnoff. Turn left and continue for a further 3km on gravel road until you reach the traffic circle.

ENTABENISAFARI CONSERVANCY

PROVINCIAL GAME AND NATURE RESERVES

D'Nyala Nature Reserve (Lephalale) Situated 10 km from the town of Lephalale en route to Botswana, this distinctively striking and tranquil resort gets its name from the massive Nyala tree that is characteristic of the area, and is also the southernmost habitat of the famous baobab tree. The game reserve is home to the nyala antelope, as well as 60 other mammal species including white rhino, giraffe, waterbuck, zebra, tsessebe, eland and others.

Animals at D'Nyala freely roam around the area including where the chalets are situated, making game viewing a door step away. It also hosts a handful of small cats, the brown hyena, black-backed jackal and the leopard. Several bird species, to the tune of 263 have been identified here including the waterfowl attracted to the area by the plains which also offer excellent game viewing opportunities.

Nylsvley Birding Lodge

An internationally renowned RAMSAR site, the 4,000-ha Nylsvley Conservancy forms part of South Africa's largest flood-plain, the 16,000-ha Nyl River Flood-plain that stretches over 70 km from Modimolle to Mokopane. It is close to the N1, South Africa's primary national road, and only one-and-a-half hours' drive from Gauteng's major urban centres.

The conservancy provides sanctuary for some 72 mammal species, including a breeding herd of the rare Roan Antelope. In years of high rainfall as many as eighty thousand migratory water birds converge



Mokolo Dam (Lephalale)

This impressive expanse of diverse African bush is adjacent to the Mokolo Nature Reserve of 4600 hectares and the Mokolo dam the biggest dam in the Limpopo Province and bordering for 6 km on the Mokolo river as it flows out of this dam.

The dammed up Mokolo river winds around beautiful mountains and is sure to calm busy spirits.

on the flood-plains, where up to 420 species have been identified.

Of this number, 365 species were identified in the reserve itself. The reserve provides habitat to 37 Red-Data species, hence its significance as a RAMSAR site. Doorndraai Dam



Doorndraai boasts a wide variety of woodland habitats such as acacia, hillside broad-leaved woodland and riverine woodland.

The reserve is also a renowned birding site and the dam a prime angling spot, while the resort is a popular destination for the whole famil enjoying various water sports.

Vhembe

The Vhembe Region is named after the impressive mountain range that stretches for some 130 km from west to east through the region. The area incorporates endless expanses of undulating indigenous bush, characterised by the remarkable form of the baobab, wonderful wildlife, a profusion of birds and exciting adventure opportunities.

The region boasts one of the most varied natural, geological, archaeological and cultural systems in the world and a fascinating history dating back many centuries when the San roamed the veld and left us their artworks on rocks. These were the times when Arabs and Indians sailed their dhows down south and traded beads and ceramics for the gold and ivory of the ancient African kingdoms ensconced in their fortresses at Mapungubwe and Thulamela.

The Soutpansberg mountain range is a unique wilderness area and has over 500 tree species of which 50 are endemic to either the Soutpansberg mountain range or the Levubu River Valley. As many as 465 species of birds- of which a number is extremely rare – as well numerous mammal, reptile and amphibian species are found in the area. The endemic butterfly, Swanepoel's Widow also occurs in this area.

Two conservancies have been established in this region to conserve our natural heritage. The one is the Western Soutpansberg Mountain Range Conservancy and encompass all the farms on the western side of the mountain range, whilst the other one encompass the Albasini Dam and part of the Levubu River Basin Wetlands and surrounding farms.





Makhado:

Makhado is named after the vhaVenda leader who ruled the area for many years. The town developed from the Voortrekker settlement in the area and was previously named after the leader Louis Trichardt. who moved away from British rule in the Cape and arrived here in 1836. After his death, en route to Lourenco Margues (now Maputo), other Voortrekker groups settled in the area, but left after Chief Makhado defeated the unruly group of ivory hunters and adventurers of Schoemansdal in 1867. Only in 1898 did the Zuid-Afrikaansche Republiek regain control of the area and establish the town of Louis Trichardt the following year in February 1899.

Several historic buildings in and around Makhado bear testimony to the years of strife which existed in the area in the early years of the settlement. The Medike rock-art site with Its fascinating murals and etchings Is one of the most popular sites open to the public In South Africa, LaJuma being another.

Makhado lies at the foot of the densely forested Soutpansberg Mountain Range, conveniently close to the Zimbabwean border and Kruger National Park. Situated In a highly fertile, rapidly growing agricultural area, the town has become one of Limpopo's premier business and tourist destinations and is the perfect springboard from which to visit the Songozwi sacred burial site of the vhaVenda, as well as Makhado's 'office', a secluded cave from where the chief conducted his campaign against the Voortrekkers. Various routes around the town highlight interesting aspects of the area.


Mukondeni Pottery

Musina: "Spoiler"

Musina in the Limpopo Valley is the northernmost town in South Africa. Situated close to the Beit Bridge border post between South Africa and Zimbabwe, it is the main entry point into the country from states north of South Africa.

The town developed around the copper mining industry in the area. Copper was first discovered in prehistoric times by the Musina people who named it 'musina', meaning 'spoiler', because they considered it a poor substitute for iron, which is what they were after.

The mineral was later rediscovered and mined by 20th century miners. Today iron, coal, magnetite, graphite, asbestos, diamonds and copper are mined here.

With fascinating attractions and many game farms in the area, tourism and hunting play an important role in the economy of the town.

The recently declared world heritage site of Mapungubwe (meaning 'Hill of the Jackal') is one of the richest archaeological sites in the country. Botanical highlights of the region include fine specimens of baobab trees and impala lilies, which are both protected species. Agricultural products include citrus, mangoes, tomatoes and dates.


Thohoyandou: The Head of the Elephant

Thohoyandu is the capital of the Venda region of the Zoutpansberg. Today it is the commercial, administrative and legislative centre of the vhaVenda' community and the proud heart of the vhaVenda nation. Named after one of their kgosi, Thohoyandou means 'head of the elephant'. The town serves a fertile agricultural area where banana plantations, hectares of subtropical fruit, tobacco and maize fields flourish. Coffee and tea plantations. grace the higher slopes. The area is well populated and dotted with many tiny villages.

The Museum of the Drum is the site of the vhaVenda royal village dating back to 1400 AD . At Tshimbubfe iron furnaces dating back to 1250 AD have been found. At Thulamela in the Kruger National Park, evidence has been found of gold smelting as early as 1300 AD.

Some of the natural attractions in the area include the 3000 year old 'Big Tree', the largest baobab in the country with a girth of 43 m near the Sagole Spa. There is also the scenic Nwanedi Nature Reserve, which is well stocked with game and has a fine resort area built around two dams. The Mphaphuli Cycad Reserve near the Makonde Village east of Thohoyandou is also worth visiting. A marked hiking route through the reserve enables visitors to appreciate the vast number of fascinating cycad species available. The Nzhelele Dam and Nature Reserve is reached by turning off from the R523 to Makhado.

One of the most significant sacred sites is the mysterious lake Fundudzi in the Mutale River. This is the only true lake in South Africa, formed in ancient times by a landslide, which blocked the course of the river, and measures 5km by 3km.








MAPUNGUBWE NATIONAL PARK

Mapungubwe declaration as a World Heritage Site has helped to highlight the significance of cultural heritage within SANParks. The inextricable links between people, biodiversity conservation and cultural heritage have become more evident through Mapungubwe. A number of initiatives have now come up within SANParks to enable a more dedicated focus on cultural heritage and community participation.

The Mapungubwe National Park provides unparalleled opportunities for the development of cultural resources as a sustainable component in the overall park development and management.

As contemporary South Africa increasingly takes interest in, and its inspiration from, the Kingdom of Mapungubwe, there are opportunities for building a national constituency across the country amongst particularly the youth. Significantly, the story of Mapungubwe and its importance in the overall history of the subcontinent has been incorporated into the national schools' curricula. 


Capricorn







MOPANI


The Mopani region in the Lowveld is one of the last unspoilt corners of Africa - vast, unhurried, timeless


The Great Olifants River meanders through the Mopani region and with the Kruger National Park forms the southern border of the province. It offers vast expanses that seem untouched by the passage of time and remain unmistakably African.

To conserve and extend this legacy, the Kruger National Park has been incorporated into the Great Limpopo Transfrontier park.

Within the Greater Kruger Park region, the full splendour of Africa's wildlife can be enjoyed. The Olifants Valley is not only rich in wildlife, but offers spectacular scenery of mountains, rivers and dams, a rich history and many cultural attractions. The contrasts in climate, scenery and landscape are both striking and dramatic.

Tour the Amarula Lapa and see how the famous Amarula Liqueur is made; take a day drive into the Kruger National Park; go on a guided tour of Modjadji and the famous rare cycads; see endangered species at the Hoedspruit Endangered Species Centre; encounter orphaned animals at Moholoholo Rehabilitation Centre.





Haenertsburg

Known as the capital of the land of the silver mist. Haenertsburg lies between Polokwane and Tzaneen on the slopes of the Wolkberg. Turn off the R71, 60km from Polokwane in the Haenertsburg village which nestles under the granite massif of the Iron Crown Mountain surrounded by lush plantations and forests. The village offers visitors a rare opportunity to really unwind- a luxury in today's hectic and busy life.

Haenertsburg has a population of about 500. It has three churches – the Mount Carmel Catholic Church, St Paul's Church (interdenominational) and the Haenertsburg Christian Church

Haenertsburg is fast becoming a hub for food lovers, book lovers, and anybody who wants to experience authentic village life. The shops offer a variety of gifts, antiques, collectibles, second-hand books, Afrikana, jewellery, and clothing. A good selection of

restaurants and coffee shops will supply refreshments and good food. The village also has a well-stocked grocery store, ATM, post office, bottle store, petrol station, and café for those last-minute purchases. The Berry Festival in February, the Haenertsburg Food, Wine, and Beer Festival at the end of April, and the Spring Festival in September are becoming increasingly popular. Visitors are treated to a rare experience of fun, high-quality goods, and a wonderful festive atmosphere.

For the energetic, the Louis Changuion Hiking Trail offers an exhilarating walk through the unique Haenertsburg Grasslands. The cemetery above the village is also worth a visit. The view of the surrounding area is spectacular and many historic graves can be seen.



THINGS TO DO IN HAENERTSBURG Haenertsburg Grassland

This is a self-guided route. The Louis Changuion Trail winds through grassland and forest patches for 10km. Visitors may find Red-winged Francolin, Broad-tailed Warbler, Grass Owl, White-necked Raven, Red-winged Francolin, Yellow Bishop, Darkcapped Yellow Warbler, Drakensberg Prinia, Cape Grassbird, Croaking, Cloud, Wailing, Lazy and Wing-snapping Cisticola.

Birding in Haenertsburg/ Magoebaskloof

The Haenertsburg village and Magoebask-loof area is located in the north-eastern escarpment section of the Drakensberg. The area's vegetation originally consisted of an escarpment mist belt and grasslands. The Woodbush State Forest is the main focus of forest birding in Magoebaskloof. Access to Woodbush is via the Forest Drive. The Forest Drive passes through about 9km of Woodbush Forest and ends up at Debegeni Falls and eventually the R71. The Forest Drive, when in good condition, can be tackled by high clearance sedans, best to do the drive from the top. It is usually recommended to drive the Forest Drive.

Agatha Crocodile Ranch

If you have never touched a baby crocodile, or fed a crocodile, now is your chance. Daily feeding tours are available.and are offered everyday between 09:00 and 16:00.

Magoebaskloof

Magoebaskloof in Limpopo province, also known as 'The land of the Silver Mist', is the kind of place you can come back to time and again — even if it's just to make sure that it's actually as beautiful as you thought it was when you saw it the first time. With the towering massif of the Wolkberg as backdrop and the pristine beauty of the surrounding grassland Haenertsburg Village will remind you of a Swiss Village, without the snow of course!

Forest Birding

The Haenertsburg village - Magoebaskloof area is located in the north-eastern escarpment section of the Drakensberg, originally made up of grasslands and mist belt forest.

Good birding can be found in areas in which the grassland or forest is largely intact.

The Woodbush Forest Drive winds through pristine afro-montane forests, down into semi-deciduous mixed forest along the lower sections of the drive. Cape Parrot, Black-fronted Bush-Shrike, Orange Ground-Thrush, Brown Scrub-Robin, Grey Cuckooshrike, Yellow-streaked Greenbul and Blue-mantled Crested Flycatcher are simply a few of the specials to be seen on this road. Also look out for African Cuckoo Hawk, Crowned Eagle and African Goshawk. Towards the bottom of the Forest Drive. where the telephone lines cross the road, look out for Eastern Bronze-naped Pigeon, which has been sighted there on a few occasions.

Tzaneen: Tropical garden Town

The Tzaneen area is a subtropical paradise filled with indigenous and exotic plants. Tzaneen itself lies peacefully at the foot of the northern Drakensberg Mountains in the heart of a forestry area and in South Africa's richest sub-tropical fruit-farming region. It is an attractive subtropical garden town with a colourful profusion of indigenous and exotic-plants and the 'capital' of the picturesque Letaba district. The valley of Tzaneen, yields Valencia oranges and grapefruit (such as Star Ruby). Bananas and macadamia nuts are also common crops in the area, with the town producing most of the country's mangoes, avocado pears, pawpaw's, tea and coffee. The town also contributes substantially to the total production of timber, citrus and litchis inter alia

The surrounding mountain slopes are heavily forested with pine and blue gum plantations and close on forty sawmills

operate in the area. Situated below the scenic Magoebaskloof, Tzaneen offers visitors a change of scenery at almost every turn. The mountainous landscape, subtropical climate, lush indigenous vegetation alternating with cultivated plantations and the largely unspoilt natural environment make this lovely area one of the most attractive recreation and tourism areas in South Africa.

There are several game and nature reserves around Tzaneen, including the famous Kruger National Park, which is only an hour's drive away. For the adventurous traveller, boating is available at the Tzaneen Dam, which is accessed via the Hans Merensky Nature Reserve. This reserve, situated on the banks of the Great Letaba River, is a worthwhile stop, accommodating a spa resort with a variety of swimming pools and a hot mineral spring.

Giyani: A place where people dance

Giyani, the Tsonga word meaning 'a place where people dance' .It is the land of "the friendly people" and was established in 1969. It is the administrative and commercial centre of the Mopani district and also the former capital of Gazankulu Banstustan.

In many ways it still resembles a friendly traditional village and the people of Giyani are known for colourful folklore, which includes two recorded folk tales, along with 1900 proverbs. Giyani is also rich in cultural history, with royal families dating as far back as 1822.


Baleni Sacred Salt

This traditional harvesting of salt is done from the sacred site of Mukhulu, a

geo-thermal hot spring on the banks of the Klein Letaba River near African Ivory Route's Baleni Camp.

The geothermal water's salt deposits into the soil of this Natural Heritage Site provide the raw material from which the traditional salt is harvested.

The local community also shares their other traditional crafts and skills with tourists. Visitors can combine a salt harvesting experience with dancing and cooking lessons, instruction in beading and basic language lessons — a true immersion into current Tsonga traditional life, as practiced by the people who live around Baleni in the Giyani district.

The Masorini Village offers a fascinating insight into a stone-age hunter-gathering society, long before the arrival of Europeans in South Africa, and is situated only 11 km from the Ba-Phalaborwa entrance gate on the way to Letaba Camp, within Kruger National Park.

TIMBAVATI & UMBABAT

GAME RESERVE

In 1956, a group of conservation minded landowners formed the Timbavati Association with the aim to reclaim the land for the benefit of all. They had come together after witnessing the degradation of a once pristine wilderness area.

Since the formation of the Timbavati Association, every landowner in the area has been encouraged to join in the conservation effort. Today there are over 50 members who have succeeded in restoring the land to its former glory, with diverse and rare wildlife species making the Timbavati their home

In 1993, in recognition of the importance of the area, the fences between the Kruger National Park and the Timbavati Reserve were removed to encourage natural species migration.

Man's incursions into this part of the Lowveld have always been temporary and brief, from early stone age down to the early 20th century. In point of fact, large tracts of land in the northern portion of the Lowveld were never permanently settled by man. The lands now comprising the Timbavati were barely touched, and are still only lightly inhabited. This part of South Africa's Bush veld region may therefore be regarded as truly unspoiled and deserves recognition as genuine wild land, as opposed to the "restored" and "restocked" lands commonly found elsewhere.









Luxury Safari experience







KRUGER NATIONAL PARK FACTS Did you know?

The surface area of Kruger National Park is 7,580 miles² (19,633 km²).

The park was first proclaimed in 1898 as the Sabie Game Reserve by the then president of the Transvaal Republic, Paul Kruger. He first proposed the need to protect the animals of the Lowveld in 1884, but his revolutionary vision took another 12 years to be realised when the area between the Sabie and

Crocodile Rivers was set aside for restricted hunting.

James Stevenson-Hamilton (born in 1867) was appointed the park's first warden on 1 July 1902.

On 31 May 1926 the National Parks Act was proclaimed and with it the merging of the Sabie and Shingwedzi Game Reserves into the Kruger National Park.

The first motorists entered the park in 1927 for a fee of one pound.

Many accounts of the park's early days can be found in the Stevenson-Hamilton Memorial Library.

There are almost 254 known cultural heritage sites in the Kruger National Park, including nearly 130 recorded rock art sites.

There is ample evidence that prehistoric man – Homo erectus roamed the area between 500 000 and 100 000 years ago Cultural artefacts of Stone Age man have been found for the period 100 000 to 30 000 years ago.

More than 300 archaeological sites of Stone Age man have been found.

Evidence of Bushman Folk (San) and Iron Age people from about 1500 years ago is also in great evidence.

There are also many historical tales of the presence of Nguni people and European explorers and settlers in the Kruger area.

There are significant archaeological ruins at Thulamela and Masorini.

There are numerous examples of San Art scattered throughout the park.

Accessible Activities & Facilities

Most Kruger Park destinations offer good general access and people with mobility challenges do make frequent use of the park.

There are a variety of accessible board-walks, trails, hides, museums, picnic sites and other visitor destinations throughout the park and readers are encouraged to view the individual rest camp profiles or the summary of gates, hides and picnic sites to get an idea of what destinations are suitable.



Hans Merensky Nature Reserve
This Lowveld bush veld reserve
offers two well-signed hiking
trails, game viewing from
your car and an informative
educational centre. Wildlife
includes sable antelope and all
the Lowveld species other than
the Big Five.

The reserve is also home to the Tsonga Kraal Museum which gives visitors the opportunity to get a glimpse of the fascinating Tsonga culture and to visit the crafts workshop.

Eiland Spa with its steaming hot waters is also located in the Hans Merensky Nature Reserve.

PROVINCIAL GAME AND NATURE RESERVES

Letaba Ranch

Situated a few kilometres north of Ba-Phalaborwa, Letaba Ranch covers just over 42 000ha.

Incorporated into the Greater Kruger National Park Conservation Area, Letaba Ranch is well known for its large herds of elephants and buffaloes. Here travellers can also view hippos and crocodiles on the banks of the mighty Letaba River.

The African Ivory Route tented bush camp Mtomeni is on Letaba

Ranch, but the game reserve is also open to day visitors for game drives in open vehicles. The gates are open daily from 6:00 to 18:00.

Shona Langa Resort

Shona Langa Resort is situated on the banks of the Olifants River 12km outside Ba-Phalaborwa "The Town of Two Summers" where a variety of game can be sighted.

Sightings range from elephant, leopard, lion, hippo, crocodile, giraffe, buffalo, impala and waterbuck, to mention but a few.

Guests might have the unexpected surprise to find an elephant or buffalo roaming around in the resort during the day or night.

Enjoy birds and game viewing from the banks of the Olifants River and the tranquility of the Bush veld in the evenings.

Modjadji Cycad Reserve
The unique Modjadji Cycad
Reserve is named after the
successive rain-making queens
who have inhabited the area
since the 16th century, guarding
the ancient cycads.

Close to Modjadjikloof, the 305-ha reserve features the world's largest concentration of a single-species cycad, also known as the 'Modjadji palm'.

The cycad nursery, picnic sites, day trails through the forest and information centre make this reserve a highlight on any tour of the Modjadji kingdom.

This breezy resort capitalizes on the striking correlation between its waters, rocks and tall trees that overshadow the beautiful wooden chalets neatly tucked alongside the river bank. The overflowing sound of water persuades its visitors to unwind and ease tension. It is a place where pure natural crystal-clear swimming pools form and waterfalls break the silence.

As in its name Lekgalameetse, 'The Place of water', hosts and generates water for most of the

prominent rivers in the Lowveld, and has water flowing through it all year round.

Lekgalameetse is equipped with four accommodation sites, in the form of seven wooden chalets, one guest house and one youth camp. All in all the reserve can host up to 43 guests.

Man'Ombe Provincial Park
Just about 6km from Giyani
lies Man'Ombe Provincial Park
covering an area of 1352 hectares.
The reserve has three hiking trails.

Tzaneen Dam Resort's

Tzaneen Dam Resort's camping site. Tzaneen dam lies in good birding area with more than 350 bird species.

Thabina Nature Reserve

The Wolkberg Wilderness Area is the largest wilderness area open to the general public in South Africa and there are many opportunities to fish, hike, climb the hills, canoe on the dam or mountain-bike through the neighbouring countryside and Thabina Dam.



SEKHUKHUNE

This region is named after King Sekhukhune, a king of the Marota(commonlyknownastheBapedi)inSekhukhuneland during the 18th century. Sekhukhune is a cross-boarder municipality between Limpopo and Mpumalanga Province

The region is endowed with mineral resources like chrome, platinum and diamond deposits. Places of interest include the Lebowa Platinum Mines, Potlake Game Reserve, Mona Meetse spring water, Ledingwe Cultural Village, Echo Stone at Phahlamanoge and Lenao la Modimo (God's Footprint). Schuinsdraai is a popular water-recreation destination where anglers can relax on the shores of Boshielo Dam.

The **Kamoka Open Africa Route** is a self-drive route that takes you to graves and battle sites, cultural villages and heritage sites. The name Kamoka is a Pedi word meaning 'together' and the route is characterized by an interesting mix of two cultures and two provinces, Limpopo and Mpumalanga.

At **Ledingwe Cultural Village,** you can go on a guided tour that reveals the history and heritage of the Ndebele people. Visit the ancestral kraal of the ancient Ndebele king, King Mayhisha III; visit traditional homesteads and meet artists in their studios, find out about the fascinating folklore and mythology of the Ndebele.

Take a tour of **Tjate.** This is a heritage site that commemorates the cultural heritage of the Bapedi people.

The region offers hunting safaris, adventure and culture and heritage experiences.





GETTING TO GROBLERSDA

By Road:

Take the N12 from Johannesburg. Then take the R25 to Groblersdal. The route is approximately 206 km and will take 2h 24 min.

Marble Hall:

Marble Hall is a small town situated in the Sekhukhune region of the Limpopo Province in South Africa. This town is located approximately 26km from Groblersdal.

Marble mining takes place at the Marble Lime Mine which is situated here. Although a small town there is a wide variety of accommodation options from Bed and Breakfasts, guest houses to game farms.

There are many activities and attractions in and around Marble Hall including hiking, biking, hunting, bow hunting and educational tours. Tourists are encouraged to visit the game and hunting farms that are part of the Loskop Game Association. 
Burgersfort: Tubatse Municipality




